Masakazu TOYODA Chairman and CEO, Japan Economic foundation (JEF)

Masakazu Toyoda is Chairman and CEO of the Japan Economic Foundation. He also serves as Special Advisor to the Institute of Energy Economics (IES, where he was previously Chairman and CEO),

Adjunct Professor with the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS) and is on the Board of Directors for the Pacific International Center for High Technology Research (PICHTR). In 2008, he was Secretary-General of the Secretariat of Strategic Headquarters for Space Policy with Japan's Cabinet Secretariat, and from 2008-08 he was Vice-Minister for International Affairs for Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (previously the Ministry of International Trade and Industry), where he has also held several other positions.



Opening remarks

Naoyuki HARAOKA Executive Managing Director, Japan Economic Foundation (JEF)

Born in Tokyo in 1955. After graduating the University of Tokyo in 1978 (Bachelor of Economics), he joined MITI (Ministry of International Trade and Industry) of Japanese government. Having been posted in the industrial policy section and the international trade policy section for a few years, he was enrolled in a two year MPA (Master of Public Administration) programme at Woodraw Wilson School of Princeton University in the US on a Japanese government sponsorship. After having acquired MPA at Princeton, he rejoined MITI in 1984 as an economist. Since then he had been posted as Deputy Director and Director of a number of MITI divisions including Research Division of International Trade Policy Bureau. He was also posted in Paris twice, firstly, Principal Economist of Trade Bureau of OECD (Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development) from 1988 to 92 and secondly Counselor to Japanese Delegation of OECD from 1996 to 99. After coming back to MITI from his second stay in Paris, at the occasion of the government structural reform in 2001 when MITI was remodeled as METI (Ministry of Economy Trade and Industry) he joined the efforts to found METI research institute, Research Institute of Economy Trade and Industry as its Director of Administration. He became Chief Executive Director of JETRO San Francisco in 2003 and stayed in San Francisco until 2006. He was Director-General of METI Training Institute from 2006 until July, 2007 when he left METI permanently and joined JEF as Executive Managing Director.

He is currently Faculty Fellow at the Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry (RIETI), Specially Appointed Fellow at the Japanese Centre for Economic Research (JCER), Senior Research Advisor, Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA), Visiting Fellow, Asian Development Bank Institute (ADBI) and Distinguished Senior Fellow at the Institute of Developing Economies (IDE-JETRO). Professor Urata received his BA in Economics from Keio University, MA and Ph.D. in Economics from Stanford University. He is a former Research Associate at the Brookings Institution, an Economist at the World Bank. He specializes in International Economics and Economics of Development. He has held a number of research and advisory positions including senior advisor to the Government of Indonesia, consultant to the World Bank, OECD, the Asian Development Bank and the Government of Japan. He has published a number of books and articles on international economic issues. His recent books include Achieving Inclusive Growth in the Asia Pacific, co-editor, Australian National University Press, 2020, Enhancing SME Participation in Global Value Chains, editor, Asian Development Bank Institute, 2021, The Effect of Globalisation on Firm and Labour Performance, co-editor, Routledge, 2021, and Globalization and Its Economic Consequences: Looking at APEC Economies, co-editor. Keiichiro KOMATSU

Principal, Komatsu Research and Advisory

Dr. Keiichiro Komatsu (D.Phil., University of Oxford) is the Founder and Principal of London-based think tank Komatsu Research and Advisory (KRA). KRA specialises in business development and country risk-analysis with global coverage.

Dr Komatsu has worked at the semi-governmental Central Co-operative Bank for Commerce and Industry (firstly in Tokyo and then as Assistant Vice-President in New York), the World Bank, the British government's Department of Trade and Industry (now Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy) and British Trade International (now Department for International Trade), and later as Special Advisor to the President of the Republic of Madagascar.

He has been working to promote sustainable trade and investment in the Indian Ocean Region as a hub that connects the African continent with Asia as well as the broader Indo-Pacific region. In this context, he has been appointed as Special Envoy for TICAD VII Public-Private Partnership by Japan's Foreign Minister on 12 July 2019, Strategic Advisor to the Economic Development Board of Mauritius under the aegis of the Prime Minister's Office of the Republic of Mauritius on 15 August 2019, Special Advisor to the Blue Economy Department under the Vice President's Office of the Republic of Seychelles on 23 August 2019.

He is also Senior Fellow to JETRO (Japan External Trade Organisation), an Agency of the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) in Japan.

He is a member of the Royal Institute of International Affairs (Chatham House), International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS), Centre for International Studies (University of Oxford), and Global Peacebuilding Association (Japan). His publications include 'Origins of the Pacific War and the Importance of "Magic".

Born in Aichi Prefecture in 1970. After taking his B.A. in Law at the University of Tokyo, he joined the International Research Division of Fuji Research Institute Corporation in 1993. During the period from 2001 to 2003, he concurrently held the position of Associate Research Fellow of the Taiwan Institute of Economic Research. In 2002, he entered Research Department (Asia) of Mizuho Research Institute Ltd. as three banks including the Fuji Bank merged and established Mizuho Financial Group. He had been Senior Economist and Chief of China Research Unit at the institute during the period from 2011 to 2017. In 2018, he assumed the current position. He has numerous books and articles on the Chinese economy, the Taiwanese economy, and the Cross-Strait economic relations including Entry into WTO Will Change China (Tokyo: Toyo Keizai Inc. 2000, coauthor), "Japanese Taiwanese Joint Ventures in China: The Puzzle of the High Survival Rate," China Information, 2009, and "The Narrow 'Breadth of R&D' and the Bottleneck of Technological Catch-up: A Case Study of Taiwan's Flat Panel Display (FDP) Industry from the Perspective of the R&D Strategy of AMOLED," in Yukihito Sato and Hajime Sato eds., Varieties and Alternatives of Catching-up: Asian Development in the Context of the 21st Century, Palgrave Macmillan, 2016. He has participated in research projects organized by the Japan Economic Foundation, the University of Tokyo, the Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry, the Japan External Trade Organization, the Institute for Developing Economies, and others.

Naoyuki Yoshino: Professor Emeritus of Keio University in Tokyo Japan, Visiting Professor at GRIPS and Director of Financial Research Center (FSA Institute, Government of Japan). Ph.D from Johns Hopkins University (where his thesis supervisor was Sir Alan Walters (UK Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher's Economic Adviser)). Assistant Professor of State University of New York, Visiting scholar at MIT (USA), Visiting Scholar at the Central Bank of Japan, Visiting Professor at the Univ. of New South Wales (Australia), Fondation Nationale des Sciences Politiques (France). He received Honorary Doctorates from Univ. of Gothenburg (Sweden) and Martin Luther University of Halle-Wittenberg (Germany). He was conferred Fukuzawa award from Keio University for his contribution to research. He was chairing Financial System Council under Prime Minister and Foreign exchange council under Finance Minister of Japan. He is currently chairing Financial education council under the Central Bank of Japan and Financial Services Agency, Government of Japan. He was the Dean/CEO of Asian Development Bank Institute (ADBI) in Tokyo (2014-2020).



Yukiko FUKAGAWA the Deputy Dean and Professor School of Political Science and Economics Waseda University

Yukiko Fukagawa is currently the Deputy Dean and Professor, School of Political Science and Economics, Waseda University. After undergraduate program at Waseda, she studied at Yale University for MA in International Development Economics, and finished Ph.D program at Waseda Graduate School of Business Studies. Her major interest lies in economic development in East Asia, especially Korea. She worked for Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) and Long-Term Credit Bank Research Institute (LTCBR) before joining the faculty member of Aoyama Gakuin University and the University of Tokyo. She came back to Waseda in 2006. She was a visiting fellow at Cambridge University in 2014, and Yonsei University in 2015. She engaged in many consultation and advisory activities for the government, such as the Committee for Industrial Structure in the Ministry of Economy and Industry etc.. Takaaki ASANO General Manager, Senior Analyst, Sumitomo Corporation Global Research

Takaaki ASANO is a General Manager/Senior Analyst at Sumitomo Corporation Global Research (SCGR). He monitors political and economic developments in North and Latin America, and also follows global geo-economic trends.

Prior to joining SCGR in 2017, he was a research fellow at Tokyo Foundation, where he followed Japanese economic diplomacy and Japan-U.S. relations. From 2005 to 2011, he was a policy research manager at the Japan Association of Corporate Executives (JACE, or Keizai Doyukai), an influential business organization in Japan, where he was responsible for JACE's international programs and edited various policy proposals.

Prior to joining JACE, he was the senior research analyst at the Representative Office of the Development Bank of Japan in Washington, DC, where he authored policy reports on a wide range of issues, from politics to financial and economic policy.

Earned M.A. in political science at New York University, and received B.A. in sociology at the University of Tokyo.



KIM Sung-Hwan Chairman of the East Asia Foundation / Former Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of the R.O.K

Sung-Hwan Kim was a career diplomat and served as the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of the Republic of Korea from October 2010 to March 2013. With a career spanning over 36 years, he held a number of senior diplomatic posts including the Senior Secretary to the President for Foreign Affairs and National Security and Vice Minister of MOFAT. He was ROK's ambassador to Austria and Permanent Representative to the International Organizations in Vienna and the ROK's Ambassador to Uzbekistan. He was appointed as a Member of the UN Secretary-General's High-Level Panel of Eminent Persons on the Post-2015 Development Agenda in July, 2010. After retiring from the Foreign Service, he served as the Chair of Institute for Global Social Responsibility and Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Seoul National University until March 2015. He also taught at Hanyang University as a Distinguished Professor and served as the Chairman of the Gangwon Art and Culture Foundation. He is now working as the Chairman of the East Asia Foundation, President of the Taejae Academy and the Chairman of the Beautiful Mind Charity Foundation.



AHN Choong-Yong Distinguished Professor, Graduate School of International Studies at Chung-Ang University

Dr. Choong Yong Ahn is currently Distinguished Professor at the Graduate School of International Studies, Chung-Ang University Seoul. He is also Co-Chair of the Korea-India Strategic Dialogue organized by the Seoul International Forum. Previously, he was Chairman, Korea Commission for Corporate Partnership (KCCP: 2014-2018) to induce voluntary collaborations between Korea's big businesses and SMEs, and also Chairman of the Board, Korea Electric Power Corporation. Before taking the KCCP post, he served as presidentially appointed Foreign Investment Ombudsman (2006-2014) for foreign direct investors in Korea. He is also former Chairman of the Presidential Regulatory Reform Committee (2010-2012). While on sabbatical from Chung-Ang University, he also served several posts such as the President of the Korea Institute for International Economic Policy (2002-2005); Chair of the APEC Economic Committee (2002-2005); Chair of Board, Choheung Bank; consultant to the World Bank; UNIDO Chief Technical Advisor to the Economic Planning Unit of Malaysia to design Malaysia's industrial master plan; and served as President of several academic societies in Korea including the Korea International Economics Association, Korean Association of Trade and Industry Studies, and the Korea Econometric Society. He was also a visiting professor to Economic Research Institute, Kyoto University, Japan. Dr. Ahn's honors include the Economist of the Year Award from the Maeil Business Daily Newspaper in Korea, the Okita Policy Research Award by the National Institute for Research Advancement in Japan for his publication on "Modern East Asian Economy," and Free Economy Publication Award by the Federation of Korean Industries. Since receiving his Ph.D. from Ohio State University, Dr. Ahn has published many articles in international journals including Review of Economics and Statistics, European Economic Review, Japanese Economic Review, Journal of Asian Economics, Global Asia, and Monograph papers in North-Holland, Cambridge University Press, Springer, Edward Elgar, Palgrave Macmillan, Iwanami Shoten of Japan, Peking University Press, etc.





KIM Sang-Hyup Chairman of 2050 Carbon Neutrality Commission

Sang-Hyup Kim is the chairman of 2050 Carbon Neutrality Commission and the former president of Jeju Research Institute, a visiting professor at Graduate School of Green Growth, College of Business, KAIST and the founder and former chairman of Coalition for Our Common Future. Prior to joining KAIST, he worked at the Office of the President of the Republic of Korea in 2008 as the Secretary for National Future and Vision, where he contributed in setting the historic "Low Carbon Green Growth" vision for Korea. In 2011, he became the Senior Secretary to the President for Green Growth, coordinating the planning, development and implementation of Korea's Green Growth strategy. Through collaboration with the Presidential Committee on Green Growth and relevant ministries, his agenda ranges from national implementation of Green Growth policies to international climate change negotiations and promoting global cooperation for making Green Growth became a truly global asset. He also served as a member of the Global Agenda Council.



CHUNG Chul Senior Research Fellow, Korea Institute for International Economic Policy(KIEP)

Chul Chung is senior research fellow of International Trade Department at the Korea Institute for International Economic Policy (KIEP), and vice chair of the Korea National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation (KOPEC). In the government, Dr. Chung served as trade advisor to the Minister of Trade, Industry, and Energy, a member of the Presidential Commission on Policy Planning, Long-term Strategy Committee chaired by Deputy Prime Minister, and Policy Advisory Committee member of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Dr. Chung has served as senior vice president of KIEP and vice president of the Korean Association of Trade and Industry Studies. He also served as the editor-in-chief of the East Asian Economic Review and the Journal of International Trade and Industry Studies. Prior to joining KIEP, he taught international economics as a professor in the School of Economics at Georgia Tech in the United States. He has also held an adjunct professorship in the Graduate School of International Studies, Seoul National University and the KDI School of Public Policy and Management. While on leave from KIEP (2009-2012), Dr. Chung worked on the ratification of the Korea-US FTA as chief economist of the Korea International Trade Association (KITA) in Washington D.C. He has published numerous academic articles and policy research papers on international trade, economic geography, and regional economic integration including APEC studies. He received Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.



YI Insill Chairwoman of Board of Institute for Sustainable Economy and Society / President of the Korean Peninsula Population Institute for future

Insill Yi is currently a Chairwoman of Board of Institute for Sustainable Economy and Society and a President of the Korean Peninsula Population Institute for future. She was a Professor of Graduate School of Economics (from September 2006) and was a Director of Nam Duck-Woo Economic Research Institute and former Vice-President for Public Affairs at Sogang University. She served for Korean government as the 12th Commissioner of Statistics Korea from the private sector also for the first time. She also served for National Assembly Budget Office as a Chief economist of Economic Analysis Division. She also worked as a senior research fellow and director of the Center for Finance and Tax, for Korea Economic Research Institute. She worked as a senior economist and team leader of financial analysis team, for Hana Bank Research Institute. She had been and is currently active in participating the governmental committees (such as Advisory Committee Member of National Assemble Budget Office, Member of Policy Advisor to Minister of Justice, and Advisory Committee Member of Financial Supervisory Service, Advisory Member of Ministry of Strategy and Finance). She is publishing books, articles and expressing various opinions in academic journals and newspapers. She served for the president and is currently honorary president of the Korean Women Economic Association, the Association of Korean Economic Studies, and the Korean Economic Association. She has a bachelor's degree in economics and geology from Yonsei University and a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota USA.



LIM Jaekyu Senior Research Fellow, Korea Energy Economics Institute(KEEI)

Jaekyu Lim currently works as a Senior Research Fellow at the Korea Energy Economics Institute(KEEI). He also serves as a member of the Special Committee of Carbon Neutrality of the Presidential Advisory Council on Science and Technology (PACST) and member of the Energy Policy Special Committee of the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy(MOTIE). He previously served as a member (Representative of Asian Region) of the Consultative Group of Experts (CGE) at the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) (Jan 2004 ~ Dec 2007), the Director of the Energy Conservation Policy Research Division (Mar 2010 ~ Aug 2013) and Managing Director of the Climate Change Policy Research Group (Sep 2013 ~ Aug 2018) at the KEEI among many other posts. He earned his B.A. of Economics at Chung-Ang University in Seoul, M.A. of Economics at University of Sydney and his Ph.D. in Economics at School of Economics in the University of New South Wales. His main research fields include the economic analysis on climate change and international trade issues including international negotiation strategies, development and application of computable general equilibrium (CGE) model (global CGE model & national CGE model), environmental policies including emission permit trading and environmental tax scheme, trade policies including environmental trade policies such as environmental tariff, and the relationship between economic growth, international trade and environment.

CHI Fulin President, China Institute for Reform and Development

Chi Fulin, Senior Research Fellow and Ph.D student supervisor, a member of the 11th and 12th National Committee of CPPCC. He is currently president of China Institute for Reform and Development (CIRD) and president of Hainan Institute for Free Trade Port Studies. He is also vice chairman of China Society of Economic Reform, vice chairman of China Society of Administrative Reform, a member of the National Experts Committee for Programming Economic and Social Development in the 13th Five-year Plan Period, policy decision-making advisor for provincial governments such as Guangdong, Shandong, Hainan and Heilongjiang. He is distinguished professor at universities including Peking University, Northeastern University and some others.

He, as an expert, has been entitled to the State Council's special allowances. He has been awarded "the Five-One Project Publications Prize", the Sun Yefang Economic Science Award and the China Development Research Award. He is also awarded the title of "Top Outstanding Talents in China" and selected as one of the "100 Economists Who Have Influenced China's Economic Construction in the Last 60 Years". His works are selected and included in the Overview on the academic Achievements of Well-known Chinese Scientists in the 20th Century (Economics Volume).

He has been dedicated to the theoretical and practical research of economic system reform for more than three decades. He has published more than 40 monographs in Chinese and English, more than 800 academic papers and more than 70 research reports. He has submitted a large number of policy recommendations, which has exerted positive impacts on decision-making and reform practices.

QUI Guohong Former Chinese ambassador to South Korea

After graduating from Shanghai International Studies University, I was assigned to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China. In 1991, I served as the Second Secretary and First Secretary of the Chinese Embassy in Japan, before serving as the First Secretary, Deputy Director and Director of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In 1998 I was appointed the Counselor of the Chinese Embassy in Japan before being promoted to become the minister. In 2006, I served as deputy director of the Department of Asian Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Later I was appointed Chinese Plenipotentiary Ambassador to Nepal from 2008 to 2011, before taking the role of Director of Security Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 2011 to 2014. Since then, I have been the Chinese Ambassador to South Korea. And most recently since June 2020, I have also become the Chief Research Fellow of Northeast Asian Affairs at the Charhar Institute.





CAO Yuanzheng Board Chairman, Research Corporation of BOC International

PhD in economics, research fellow. Dr. Cao has long been working been in the State Commission for Economic System Restructuring and had been engaged in policy making and theoretical research on China's economic system reform and macro economy. He joined Bank of China (BOC) International in late 1990s and dedicated to the implementation of economic system reform measures. He was Director, Executive Vice President and Chief Economist of BOC International (China), Chief Economist of BOC. He has a teaching role in Renmin University of China, Peking University, Tsinghua University and Fudan University. He holds various positions including the Vice Chairman of China Society of Macroeconomics. He is an expert/advisor for the WB, ADB, UNDP, and transitioning economics as Vietnam, Mongolia, Czech Republic, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Uzbekistan, as well as many provinces in China.





TIAN Xueyuan

Academician of Chinese Academy of Social Sciences

Tian was graduated from the department of economy at Peking University in 1964. He has been Guest Researcher at the East-West Center from 1982 to 1983, and been the director of the Institute of Population and Labor Economics at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences from 1984 to 1998. And he is also a member of the Expert Advisory Committee of national social sciences research. Professor Tian has published more than 500 journal articles and 12 books. Among which, three of his books have been translated into other languages such as English, Japanese, and Russian. He has conducted innovative research in quite a few areas such as population development strategy, cost-benefit study of children to a society, population and sustainable development, and so on. He has been honored among the first as the national "Young Expert with Outstanding Contributions", and he has also been awarded the first prize of National Science and Technology for technological achievement, the Chinese Population Award (top prize in Chinese population studies), National Book Award, International Intellectual Celebrity (awarded by the IBC in UK), and the World's Five Thousand Celebrity (titled by the ABI in the US).




GUO Yanjun Director, Institute of Asian Studies, China Foreign Affairs University
