



Profiles of Keynote Speakers & Panelists

Peter Bekx is the Director of International Economic and Financial Affairs in the European Commission's Directorate General for Economic and Financial Affairs. Prior to that, he was the Director of Business Statistics in Eurostat. He was Professor of Economics at the Free University of Brussels for six years. In 1985, he joined the European Commission and has held a number of posts.

Sahoko Kaji is a Professor at Keio University and received her B.A. and M.A. in economics from Keio University, and a Ph.D. in economics in 1992 from The Johns Hopkins University. She is also Deputy Director of the EUSI (EU Studies Institute) and her publications include "Euro Kiki de Nihon wa Dounarunoka" (What the Euro Crisis means to Japan), Nihon Keizai Shimbun Publishing, 2012.

Moreno Bertoldi is Head of the Unit responsible for Countries of the G-20 - IMF and G-Groups at the Directorate General for Economic and Financial Affairs of the European Commission. He is also the commission representative in the G-20 Framework for Growth Working Group.

Eiji Yamashita is Professor Emeritus at Osaka City University from April 2011. After having worked as international economist at the Bank of Tokyo, he joined the Faculty of Economics, Osaka City University in 1988 and later became Professor at Graduate School of Economics, Osaka City University (OCU). He was also Visiting Fellow, Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies, the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence, Italy in 2008. He has received his B.A. in economics from Keio Gijuku University in 1970, and Ph.D in Economics from OCU in 2003. His publications include "The Regime Transformation of International Monetary System: the Case against Floating Exchange Rates Revisited" (Toyokeizai-shinposha in Tokyo in September 2010) and "The European Economic and Monetary Union; Its Making and Lessons for Asia" (Keiso Shobo, July 2002).

Sayuri Itoh is a Senior Economist at NLI Research Institute (subsidiary of Nippon Life Insurance Co.), and also a lecturer for Dokkyo University. She has received her B.A. in economics from Waseda University in 1987, and M.A in commerce, Graduate School of Commerce, Waseda University in 2005. She worked at the Industrial Bank of Japan for 1987-2001. Her research area is short-term and medium-term economic forecasts of Europe, and economic and monetary integration of Europe. Her publications include "Introduction to Monetary Theory (in Japanese)" (Showa-do, 2009) and "European Economy" (Minerva Shobo, 2011).
