#### Asia-Pacific Forum

The Asia-Pacific Forum is held annually. In recent years we have held the Forum jointly with the Singapore Institute of International Affairs (SIIA), the Thai APEC Study Center (TASC) of Thammasat University, the Asian Institute of Management (AIM, Philippines), and the Korea Institute for International Economic Policy (KIEP). This year's Forum will be held in Jakarta jointly with the Centre for Strategic and International Studies, Jakarta (CSIS).

#### Japan-US Forum

JEF hosts the Japan-US Forum in partnership with the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations and the Pacific Council on International Policy, and in 2003 with the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) and CCFR. With our former co-host, the Aspen Institute, we held the forum over a period of 13 years.

#### Japan-Europe Forum

JEF hosts the Japan-EU Forum every year jointly with the Institute Aspen France. The 2006 Forum will take place in London in partnership with Chatham House.

### **JEF's Major Activities**

#### International Publicity

As one of its principal activities, JEF publishes a bimonthly magazine. "Journal of Japanese Trade and Industry" was launched

in 1982 to help bridge the information gap between Japan and the rest of the world. This bimonthly publication is a source of in-depth, analytical, historical and cultural information on Japan's trade, business, economic issues, current events, legislation and politics.

#### Japan-UK High Technology **Industry Forum**

The Japan-UK High Technology Industry Forum is held every year, alternately in Japan and the UK, under the guidance of the British Department of Trade and Industry and the Japanese Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry. The 20th Forum was held in Osaka in 2005.

#### **Inviting Prominent People from Various Countries**

JEF invites prominent people in the economic area from various countries to Japan to deepen their understanding of the Japanese economy and society through exchanges of opinions with leading Japanese figures and through visits to Japanese companies. JEF has hosted such activities 22 times, inviting a total of 289 people from 28 countries.

#### Research Activities

JEF believes that Japanese companies and industries need to keep ahead of the changes in the global economy.

In order to realize this goal, JEF conducts research activities on economic trends in Western and Asian countries and the economic policies of major countries, and

communicates the results to the related industries and policy authorities.

JEF is funded from the proceeds of the sale of the Shin-Sakura Maru, a ship used for floating fairs. The Shin-Sakura Maru made a major contribution to the revival of the Japanese economy and the promotion of Japanese exports after World War II. The ship completed its mission in the 1970s.
