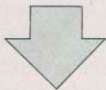
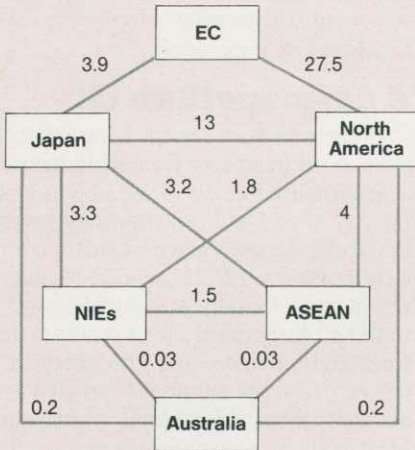

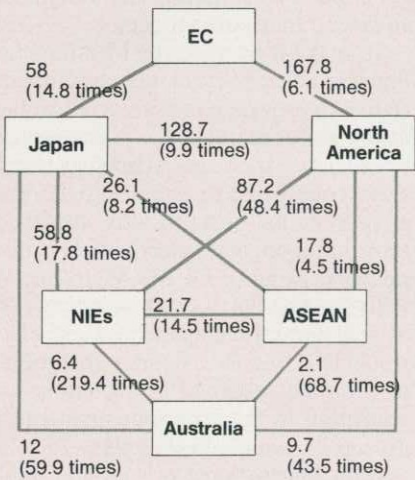
Development of Trade in Asia-Pacific Region

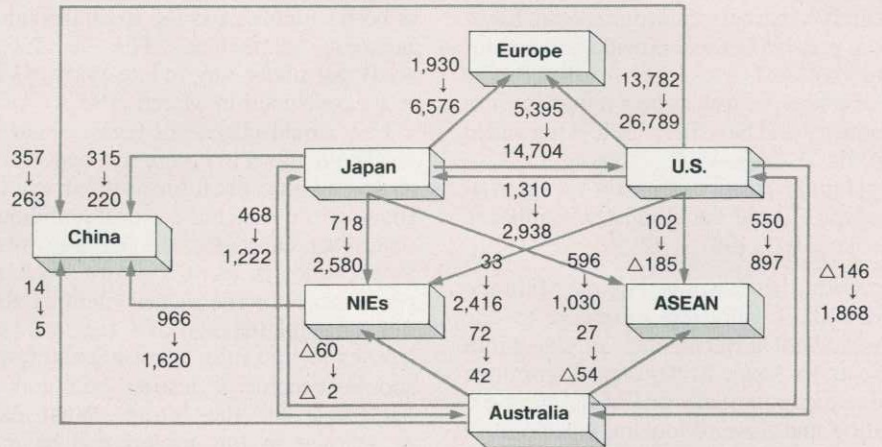

Region-wise Direct Investment by Japan, U.S. and Australia

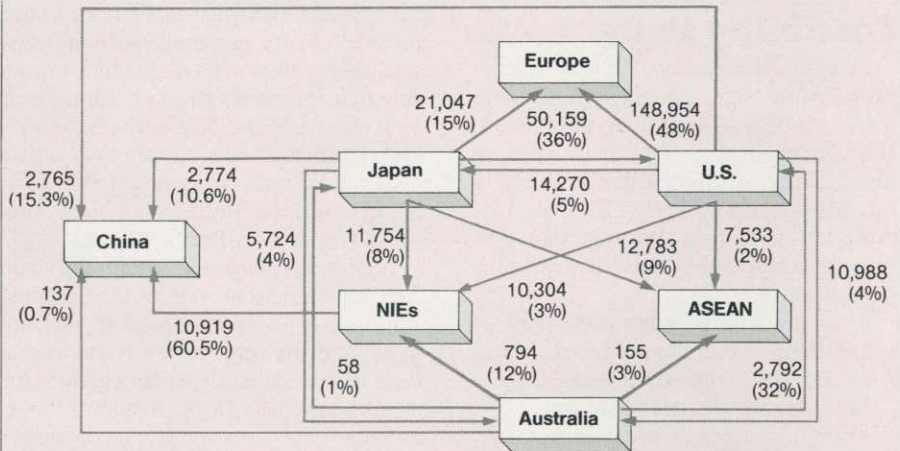
(\$ million)

 3. Investment in China represents 1979-1986 total; Japanese investment in China represents 1979-September 1988 total.
 4. ASEAN denotes Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia and Philippines.
 5. NIEs receiving Australian investment are Hong Kong and Singapore only. ASEAN countries receiving Australian investment include Brunei.
 6. NIEs investors in China are Hong Kong, Macao and Singapore.
